Essentials of Discipleship Chapter 8 – The Church and Body Life

Resource: Essentials of Discipleship by Francis Cosgrove published by Roper Press in 1988.

This short 12 chapter book outlines eleven essentials of what a disciple of Jesus Christ is and how each disciple should become a disciple-making disciple. These study guides offer an outline of the book with some questions to be used in reviewing and discussing the content. Each student will need to obtain and read the book as well. After the initial chapters titled: What is a Disciple? & The Disciple is a Learner; the author reviews the Lordship of Jesus Christ which is the umbrella for the remaining nine essentials or characteristics of a disciple.

- I. Introduction EOD #7: A disciple attends church regularly to worship God, to have his or her spiritual needs met, and to make a contribution to the body of believers. (Reminder the Church is the people not a building.)
 - A. Summary (from Chapter 1):

Christian fellowship is part of God's Plan. Since the early church, men and women came to the Savior to band together in small groups to form churches. These were the bases to evangelize the regions near them. Paul's mission trips resulted in new church fellowships. His first objective was evangelism which is the proclamation of the Gospel. The second objective was follow-up (read Acts 14:22). He sought to strengthen the disciples (people not organizations) to remain true to the faith in Christ. Thirdly, Paul was committed to church planting with the appointment and training of elders (leaders). Hebrews 10:24-25 warned against forsaking the gathering together for many benefits.
