Essentials of Discipleship

Chapter 9 – Christian Fellowship

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Resource: <u>Essentials of Discipleship</u> by Francis Cosgrove published by Roper Press in 1988.

This short 12 chapter book outlines eleven essentials of what a disciple of Jesus Christ is and how each disciple should become a disciple-making disciple. These study guides offer an outline of the book with some questions to be used in reviewing and discussing the content. Each student will need to obtain and read the book as well. After the initial chapters titled: What is a Disciple? & The Disciple is a Learner; the author reviews the Lordship of Jesus Christ which is the umbrella for the remaining nine essentials or characteristics of a disciple.

Introduction – EOD #8: A disciple fellowships regularly with other believers displaying love and unity.

A. Summary (From Chapter 1):

Similar to the preceding essential of discipleship, this chapter emphasizes the essential of maintaining fellowship with other believers. Cosgrove says that Christians are to associate with other believers and show unity with all believers, not just those in your own local church fellowship. 1 John 1:3 and Ephesians 4:3 affirm this privilege and responsibility. The Body of Christ already has an eternal spiritual unity but it is a challenge for us to maintain unity on a daily basis. This unity moves forward the cause or mission of Christ and His Church.
